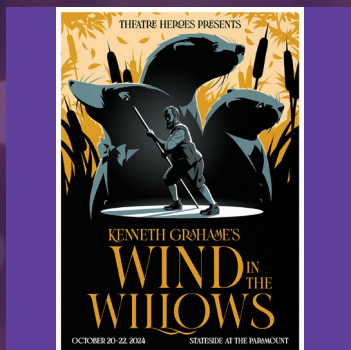


The Magic School Bus: Lost in the Solar System
